MEDICAL THIRD-PARTY ADMINISTRATOR & PHARMACY BENEFIT MANAGER CONTRACTS

On October 8, PERMA released a memo to the Fund regarding the status of the Medical Third Party Administrator (TPA) RFP. In absence of the authorization to release an RFP through the Health Insurance Fund Cooperative, PERMA has received a one-year EUS contract proposal with Aetna and AmeriHealth which was shared with the Fund Attorney. The memo is included in Appendix III which includes the financial and contractual improvements, along with the savings that has been included in the 2026 budget.

In addition, the MRHIF Executive Committee received a similar memorandum requesting the Executive Committee extend its agreement with Express Scripts through the Level Care Coalition. In this case, the master terms and conditions are set forth through the Level Care Coalition of which the Funds must abide, but the Level Coalition uses a national pharmacy consultant, Risk Strategies, to analyze and seek out the best financial arrangement for its members within. The memo is included in Appendix III which summarizes the 2026 financial terms that equate to a savings of about 7%, statewide.

Since the Fund will be unable to release an RFP with a January 1, 2026 effective date for this contract, the Fund Attorney is recommending the MRHIF use the one-year extension language in the current contract through December 31, 2026.

Resolution 37-25 approves the Medical TPA extension. The PBM resolution will be made at the next MRHIF meeting.

NEW MEMBERS - JANUARY 1, 2026

The Fund has received additional membership applications since the last meeting. There are two potential prospects. Neither group has submitted a resolution or Indemnity and Trust agreement, but the Acutary has certified a quote that may be beneficial for the Fund. The recommendation is to offer membership on (or around) January 1, 2026. Resolution 38-25 is in consent.

2025 National Preferred Formulary (NPF) - Effective 7/1/25 (previously reported)

Brokers were sent the updated 2025 Formulary and Exclusions lists effective July 1, 2025, the week of April 21st and May 6, 2025. There are 28 members in SNJHIF impacted by the formulary change. Please note the following:

NPF:

- NPF Exclusions List, please note the following:
 - \circ **Humalog** excluded for members with a new prescription as of 1/1/25, members currently taking the drug will be excluded effective 1/1/26
 - Members should share the covered preferred alternatives provided in the list with their providers
 - The number of impacted members will be provided later in 2025

Encircle Program (GLP-1 Weight Loss) (previously reported)

Effective September 1, 2024:

- Members with new prescriptions, including renewal prescriptions for expired prior authorizations (PA), will need to meet the following criteria to be approved for a GLP-1 weight loss medication:
 - o BMI > 32 OR
 - BMI between $27 \le 32$ WITH 2 or more documented comorbidities
- Members with an active approved PA prior to 9/1/2024 will be grandfathered
 - o Upon renewal of their PA, members will need to meet the above BMI requirements to be considered for approval

Effective January 1, 2025:

Members who have an approved PA (active and new) will need to meet the following guidelines:

- Members will receive a welcome kit from Omada free of charge. The kit includes a digital scale and information on downloading the mobile app and/or using the web browser. The scale is programmed to the member's ESI active account prior to delivery. The scale will record each weigh-in and will update the member's file automatically. Members must weighin a minimum of 4 times a month
- Members must engage with an assigned online Omada coach via a mobile application or web browser a minimum of 4 times a month

If members do not adhere to both of the requirements outlined above, the following month in which they are non-compliant, they will not be able to refill their weight loss prescription. Members will be required to complete the missing weigh-ins and/or online coaching engagement in order to refill their prescription.

Based on the above, communications are being updated and will be sent to members once finalized. Sample communications will be sent once finalized.

2025 Legislative Review:

Medical and Rx Reporting: None

No Surprise Billing and Transparency Act (previously reported)

The Health Insurance Funds, including SNJHIF protect plan members from surprise billing with involuntary out of network balance bills with a hold harmless clause:

- Example: an in-network surgeon contracts with an out-of-network anesthesiologist. Should the out of network anesthesiologist balance bill the patient, the Funds would hold the member harmless, paying up to the invoiced amount.

The law also imposes certain requirements on the Carriers, PBMs and healthcare providers. Many of these requirements continue to be delayed, but we will continue to work with the insurance providers to assure the SNJHIF remains compliant.

- Issuing updated ID Cards with additional out of pocket information
- Providing transparency in coverage machine-readable files
- Providing price comparison tools
- Healthcare providers should work with insurance carriers to provide potential patients with good faith estimates of costs

2023 Specialized Audits (previously reported)

As approved through an RFP through the Program Manager's contract, the HIFs has acquired the services of AIM to conduct specialized audits for the Southern New Jersey Health Insurance Fund (SNJHIF). AIM will complete medical claims audits for claims administered by Aetna. The claim audit being performed will determine Aetna's claim processing and financial accuracy of medical claims. AIM will also perform an Operation Review. Aim will perform an in-depth evaluation of the controls employed by the Aetna to ensure quality administration. **SNJHIF audit began May 6, 2024**

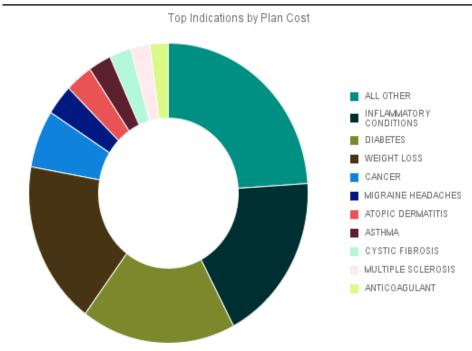


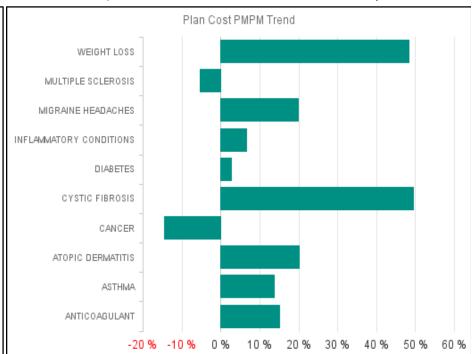

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

FAST TRACK FINANCIAL REPORT – Mr. Brandon Lodics stated that there was no updated financial fast track report to present.

2026 SNJHIF BUDGET - INTRODUCTION - Mr. Lodics reviewed the budget presentation, noting that claims through June 30, 2025, were submitted to the actuary for projections. Medical claims were projected to increase by approximately 14.4%, prescription claims by 35%, and dental by 10%, citing increased costs for specialty medications such as GLP-1 weight loss and diabetes treatments, as well as emerging cancer drugs.

The MRHIF assessment was projected to increase 19.37%, aligning with statewide trends. Mr. Lodics explained that Medicare Advantage costs would rise approximately 19%, partly due to federal subsidy reductions under the Inflation Reduction Act.

He recommended adding an additional \$1 million to the loss fund contingency to protect against market volatility and utilization spikes, noting this would bring the overall budget increase to roughly 17%. The Finance Committee had reviewed the proposal and supported the introduction of the budget. The rate action was then discussed, with medical rates increasing by 15%, prescription rates by 32%, dental rates by 10%, and Medicare Advantage rates by 19%. Variations in assessments were noted, attributed to factors such as loss ratio adjustments, coverage lines, and legacy account subsidies. The five-year average increase stands at 8.14%, which, while higher than historical averages, remains below the state's 10% trend.

Mr. Lodics also addressed claims performance tracking and measurement, noting higher increases statewide due to utilization spikes and rising unit costs. A new approach to setting trends was adopted, using 25% historic trend and 75% market trend. Key drivers include the No Surprises Act, specialty medications like GLP-1s, hospital negotiations, and inpatient utilization changes. Additional slides detailing utilization statistics were made available for further review.

Motion: Motion to introduce the 2026 Southern New Jersey Regional Employee Benefits Fund Budget in the amount of \$156,242,089 and to advertise a public hearing of the budget adoption on October 27, 2025, via zoom.

NO SURPRISES ACT LEGISLATIVE LETTER - Jim Rhodes provided an update on advocacy efforts regarding the No Surprises Act and its impact on health insurance funds statewide. He detailed outreach to legislators, including letters to New Jersey congressional members and collaboration with organizations such as the American Benefits Council and the Coalition Against Surprise Medical Billing. Rhodes emphasized the need for changes to the independent review process to address claim backlogs and budgetary challenges.

Further discussions touched on Assembly Bill 5903, which proposes changes to the State Health Benefits Commission and local government requirements. Rhodes highlighted potential implications for local plans and encouraged proactive engagement with labor unions to explore cost-saving measures. He also addressed the financial difficulties faced by the local government section of the State Health Benefits Program, including a projected 36.7% premium increase for 2024.

The meeting concluded with a discussion on the challenges of managing health plans amid rising costs and the importance of advocating for effective solutions at both state and local levels. The Chair thanked attendees for their participation and reiterated commitment to addressing these issues collaboratively.

BROKER PAYMENTS

A few months ago, PERMA advised that it is more appropriate for monthly commissions to be paid direct to our broker partner's firms rather than being collected by the Program Manager and dispersed. This switch will occur in January 2026. Communications outlining the new process will be sent to all brokers prior to that.

MRHIF UPDATE

The MRHIF met on September 19, 2025 primarily to introduce its 2026 budget. A verbal report will be provided at the meeting.

LOCKBOX PRICING

The Treasurer has received pricing for the implementation of a lockbox service for the Southern New Jersey Health Insurance Fund. The proposed cost of \$2,100 per year (approximately \$175 per month) is deemed reasonable given the size and volume of transactions managed by the SNJHIF. In light of the increase in mail fraud, the lockbox will help protect our member's checks from being altered or stolen. Upon approval of the cost, the Treasurer will initiate the set up. When complete, PERMA will release the new address and reach out to members to ensure a smooth transition.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Resolution 33-25 is included on page 13 to go into closed session to discuss procurements and contracts.

PROGRAM MANAGERS REPORT - Ms. Crystal Bailey presented operational updates, beginning with a reminder about the client service team contacts available for day-to-day inquiries regarding billing and enrollment. Additionally, whole system training sessions are held every third Wednesday of the month at 10:00 AM, and members were encouraged to reach out to the HIP training team for access and training needs. Open enrollment for January 1, 2026, was announced as a passive enrollment period, scheduled from October 20th through October 31st, with updates to be completed in WEX by November 14th to ensure timely delivery of medical ID cards. Communications regarding open enrollment were being finalized and would be distributed within the week.

Coverage updates included changes to Express Scripts, specifically the exclusion of Humalog starting January 1, 2026, for new prescriptions. Members currently taking the drug must provide substantiation for its necessity over suggested alternatives. Updates on the Encircle program for GLP-1 weight loss medications were also provided, noting that members who meet program requirements, such as regular weigh-ins and check-ins, have been able to access their medications without issue. Challenges primarily stemmed from members not meeting BMI requirements or failing to fulfill program criteria. Legislative reviews revealed no changes since the last meeting, one appeal under review, and no IR submissions or small claims committee submissions.

TREASURER: Reviewed the bills list for September 2025 bills list. Fund Treasurer also reviewed the treasurers report.

FUND ATTORNEY: Fund Attorney Mr. Harris provided a verbal report to the Executive Committee, noting that his written report was included in the agenda and that additional comments would be discussed in Closed Session under Resolution 33-25.

He began by addressing recent media coverage and a published report from the OSC relating to the operations and structure of New Jersey Health Insurance Funds.

Mr. Harris explained that the OSC report raised questions about professional arrangements and shared service models utilized by multiple HIFs statewide. He emphasized that the Southern New Jersey Regional Employee Benefits Fund (SNJHIF) has consistently operated in full compliance with all applicable laws and DOBI regulations.

He further clarified that the HI Fund website referenced in the article was a marketing resource developed jointly by the various regional HIFs to provide educational materials and transparency to member entities. He confirmed that it is not a separate legal entity, does not hold or manage Fund assets, and exists solely for public information and outreach.

Commissioner Shannon asked whether the OSC's findings would require any policy or contractual changes for the SNJHIF. Mr. Harris responded that no immediate action was necessary, reiterating that the Fund's structure—specifically the engagement of PERMA Risk Management Services and Conner Strong & Buckelew as administrators and program managers—was properly authorized through resolution, bid, and QPA review under N.J.A.C. 11:15-2.6 and N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5(1)(a)(i). Commissioner Passanante expressed appreciation for the clarification, commenting that public confidence in the Fund's transparency is essential and that it was important to record the Fund's position clearly in the minutes. Commissioners agreed, adding that the article appeared to mischaracterize the cooperative model used by joint insurance funds statewide.

Mr. Harris reiterated that shared-service arrangements are expressly permitted under New Jersey law and that the Fund's professionals regularly file all required documentation—including procurement certifications, contracts, and annual audits—with DOBI. He advised that no corrective actions or structural changes were recommended at this time, but that the Fund would continue to monitor any guidance issued by the Comptroller's Office.

The attorney provided an update on recent developments, including changes to FDA advertising regulations requiring pharmaceutical companies to include full safety warnings in direct-to-consumer ads. This amendment, effective September 9, 2023, may impact advertising practices and potentially reduce costs associated with pharmaceutical marketing.

AETNA: Mr. Silverstein was absent. Report is included in the agenda.

AMERIHEALTH: Kristina Strain reviewed the AmeriHealth report for the month of August.

EXPRESS SCRIPTS: Ms. Hiteksha Patel presented the Express Scripts Report. Specialty medication costs were highlighted, with weight loss plan costs increasing by 50% due to new indications for medications like Wegovy. Other conditions, such as multiple sclerosis and cancer, saw decreases in plan costs. The report also noted the impact of new dosage forms, such as injectable pens, on cost increases.

Ms. Patel highlighted significant trends, including a 52% increase in weight-loss drug costs and a decrease in costs for multiple sclerosis and cancer treatments. She also noted the impact of the Encircle program on prior authorizations for weight-loss drugs. Humira costs decreased by 45.5% due to its exclusion from the formulary as of July 2025. With no questions, Ms. Patel concluded her report.

PUBLIC COMMENT: Public comment was then opened, during which concerns were raised regarding the state comptroller's report on transparency, contracting processes, and potential conflicts of interest within the fund. Representatives from the public expressed concerns about taxpayer dollars, pay-to-play practices, and the need for greater accountability. The fund's attorney responded, providing clarifications on the issues raised, including the lack of conflict of interest, the role of the Department of Banking and Insurance in oversight, and the use of qualified purchasing agents for contracting processes. Mr. Harris reiterated for the record that the Fund's contractual relationships are governed by state statute and that the Fund operates as a public joint insurance entity under N.J.S.A. 40A:10-36 et seq. He explained that all professional contracts are publicly bid, reviewed by the Fund's Qualified Purchasing Agent, and approved annually by resolution during the Fund's reorganization meeting. He assured the public that

no funds are exchanged outside of approved bill lists, which are reviewed and certified monthly by the Treasurer and Fund Administrator.

Subject: One-Year Agreements TPAs

At the direction of the HIF Cooperative counsel, Mr, Ken Harris, and in light of the Office of the State Comptroller's (OSC) insistence that precluded running our usual RFP process this cycle, PERMA negotiated interim one-year agreements the two third party administrators (TPAs), Aetna (all Funds) and AmeriHealth for 2026. Our objective is protecting the Funds and maintain market leverage while addressing compliance sensitivities and timing constraints. The memorandum shall address the process and results that will technically apply to the Fund.

Process and Vendor Engagement

In lieu of a formal RFP, we conducted a structured review of current terms and performance. We issued each carrier a written set of questions and requirements, focusing on: (1) reductions in fixed administrative costs; (2) contractual improvements that strengthen protections for the Funds; and (3) operational commitments to improve service and accountability.

Results - Financial and Contractual Improvements

We insisted upon—and obtained—meaningful concessions designed to directly benefit the Funds for the one-year bridge period. This is summarized as follows:

- Fixed Cost Reductions: Reductions to the administrative / ASO fees and other non-claim expenses
- Out of Network Service Fees: Secured reductions to the out of network fees and caps to apply discounts
- Enrollment based sliding fee scale
- Embedded return on investment (ROI) guarantees for recommended Carrier sponsored cost containment programs
- Performance, financial accuracy, and operational guarantees worth up to 25% of administrative fee

Estimated Value ("Savings")

Conservatively, the negotiated concessions are projected to generate approximately \$4.25-\$4.75 million across all Funds (including your Fund and the other Funds that also participate with the MRHIF) in avoided costs over the one-year term, driven primarily by fixed-fee reductions and targeted contractual caps. Estimated savings is based on existing enrollment as of October 2025 and does not contemplate additional savings as the result of new members.

Request for Approval and Immediate Next Steps

We will ask that the Fund pass a resolution at its next meeting officially accepting the 2026 terms as negotiated by this office. If you have any questions in the interim, please contact our office.

Subject: 2026 Level Care Rx Values

Dear Joe:

Risk Strategies Consulting's ("RSC", "us" or "we") was engaged by Level Health Solutions ("Level Care") to support their vendor selection process for the self-insured pharmacy benefits program for their members. As part of this engagement, RSC assisted Level Care with the RFP process for selecting a new pharmacy benefit manager (PBM). Our role included conducting comprehensive evaluations of each vendor's services, contract terms, and pricing. This support also involved assessing the estimated financial impact of the proposed vendor options relative to Level Care's current PBM arrangement.

Level Care has requested that RSC provide a memorandum documenting our estimates of the potential financial impact of the proposed program change on current costs, excluding any assumptions related to changes in utilization or service mix. This memorandum is intended to fulfill that request.

The remainder of this document outlines the results of our review, the methodologies employed, and any notable findings relevant to the analysis.

Methodology and Data

To model the potential financial impact of converting to from traditional spread arrangements to ESI's net acquisition cost program, RSC performed a repricing of Level Care's 2024 pharmacy benefit claims experience at ESI's proposed contractual terms and rates for 2026.

To reflect anticipated 2026 cost and utilization levels, the following trends were applied to the 2024 experience:

- Annual Unit Cost Trend (Average Wholesale Price (AWP) per script) +5.9%
- Annual Utilization Trends (Scripts Per Member) +1.75%

To reflect the potential variation in trend assumptions, a range of potential cost impacts were developed, assuming that potential AWP unit cost estimates vary between +/- 2.25% - 2.75%.

The impact of utilization shifts, potential new drugs, membership, or future member cost share changes was not contemplated in the analysis.



Financial Savings Indications

Our analysis indicated the financial savings generated by the proposed ESI Net Acquisition Plan program terms relative to the current vendor 2026 contract terms to be as follows:

^{*}Gross Cost Net Savings are estimated savings in drug costs to the plan after discounts, dispensing fees and rebates are considered. (does not include member cost share).

RSC recommends that Level Care assumes no more than 50% of the potential savings in future estimates to recognize the uncertainty of future cost projections inherent to prescription drug program pricing. Factors such as uncertainty in future cost and utilization trends, potential utilization shifts due to new drug treatments, and changes in drug mix contribute to overall unpredictability.

Additional detail in terms of the potential financial savings indicated in the results of our RFP review for Level Care's pharmacy program can be found in the power point presentation provided to Level Care (Level Care RFP Results, dated March 14, 2025).

^{**} Savings % were generated modeling proposed contract terms to 2024 base experience. As indicated in the methodology section of this report, savings don't consider utilization or drug mix shifts.



 The assumptions underlying the results summarized above are based on actual plan data/experience and informed judgment. The data and experience provided are assumed to be accurate and complete. If the data and experience provided are inaccurate or incomplete, our results would need to be revised accordingly.

In our opinion, the approach and assumptions used to develop the estimated cost impacts are reasonable in the aggregate, based on the data/information provided and on our experience; however, future experience is inherently uncertain and may differ from these results, perhaps significantly. As a result, we recommend that Level Care continually monitor emerging experience and adjust as necessary.
